

# CUSD's 2011 INTERNET SAFETY CONTEST

Collinsville classes (Grades K-12) are invited to participate in another exciting contest as part of Unit 10's 2011 Internet Safety Month!

Teachers – put together a team of students, conduct some research, brainstorm and create a unique project that helps teach others about Internet Safety. You could win a cool prize for your classroom!

## The Rules:

Your team should create and submit an original work in one of the following categories:

- Short film/video – the short film or video should be 3-5 minutes in length and should be created using Microsoft Movie Maker or similar video production software.
- Music video – the song should be written (original lyrics) produced and sung by students on the team.
- Public Service Announcement/News Release – the PSA should be written, directed and announced by your team of students.

You must follow good safety rules when creating these projects – do not include students' last names in writing or audio (except on your submission form, which will only be viewed by the judges). You must have a parental release form signed and submitted with the project for any students who are videotaped or whose photos are used in the presentation. The form is located at:

You must follow copyright laws – you may not use copyrighted music or images in your projects.

**Each team must have a teacher sponsor** who is an active participant and helps oversee the project. The number of team participants cannot exceed the number of students in the teacher's class. The use of technology staff members for assistance with the project, if desired, is permitted. Please involve the entire class in this project if possible.

## Submitting Your Project

K-8 projects must be submitted no later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, April 22, 2011 than to your building Computer Support Specialist. High school projects (grades 9-12) must be submitted to the high school office no later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, April 22, 2011. **LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR PRIZES.**

A team of district judges will review all entries submitted and select a winner in each of the following grade categories:

Grades K-2

Grades 3-4

Grades 5-6

Grades 7-8

Grades 9-12

## Prizes

The teacher sponsor of each winning team will receive a digital camera for their classroom!
